

In the beginning, there was only undifferentiated water swirling in chaos.


Then Gods were formed, war broke out, earth was created as a result of the war, then man was created to serve the gods.




The different creation myths have some elements in common. They all held that the world had arisen out of the lifeless waters of chaos, called Nu.

Eight gods in the water converged resulting in upheaval resulting in a pyramid mound. From this the sun rose to light the world.



Anaximander of Mietus was a pre-Socratic Greek philosopher who lived in Miletus, a city of Ionia (in modern-day Turkey).






Greece

Land-dwelling ancestors must have been born in water and live partially on land. Man needs prolonged nursing to survive therefore he must be the child of a different type of animal.








Seventh-day Baptists "broke from the Baptist church in order to keep the Sabbath..." in 1671.
