


1 - Regarding Matthew, "there is no patristic evidence that anyone else was ever proposed as the author."




2 – Papias, Irenaeus of Alexandria, Eusebius, and Origen all affirm Matthean authorship.





When Jesus heard that, He said to them, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick.




But go and learn what this means: 'I desire mercy and not sacrifice.' For I did not come to call the righteous, but sinners, to repentance."

And Barnabas and Saul returned from Jerusalem when they had fulfilled their ministry, and they also took with them John whose surname was Mark.






It was here that Mark, overwhelmed with fear and discouragement, wavered for a time in his purpose to give himself wholeheartedly to the Lord's work.

Then after some days Paul said to Barnabas, "Let us now go back and visit our brethren in every city where we have preached the word of the Lord, and see how they are doing."




Now Barnabas was determined to take with them John called Mark.


