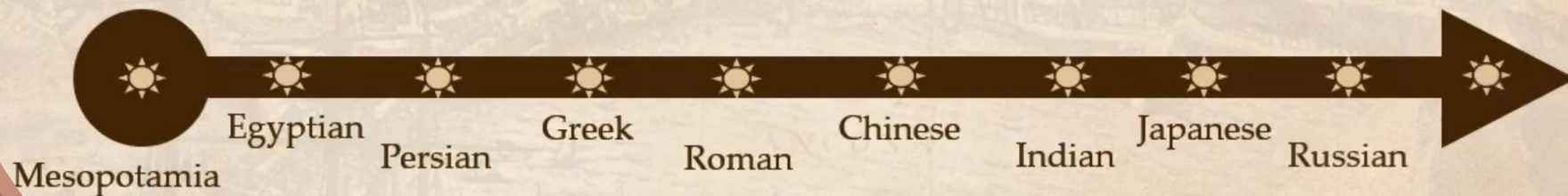

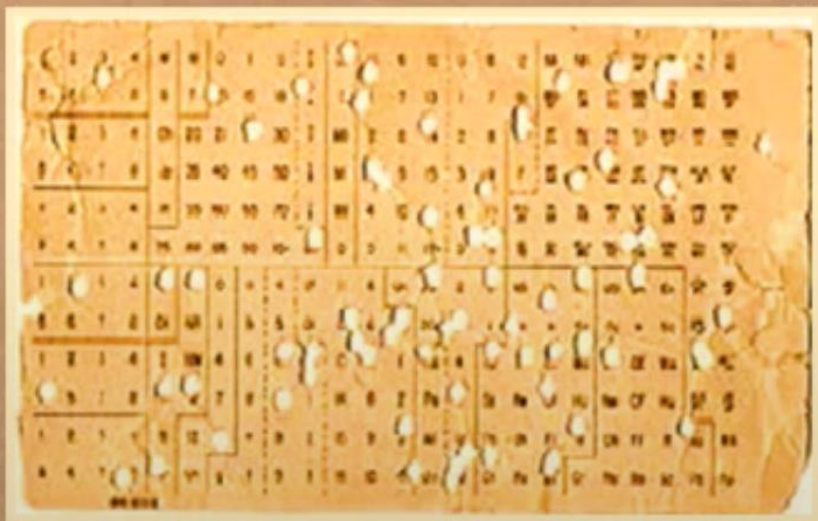

It was a table of successive columns which was based on their 'BASE 60' number system.



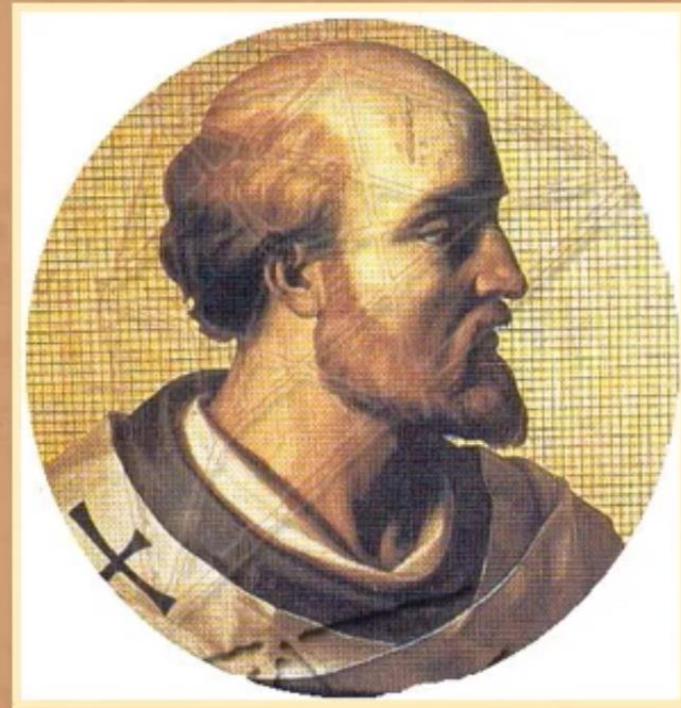
ROMAN ABACUS

In ancient Rome, process of calculation was similar as in Greece, by moving counters(pebbles) on a smooth table.

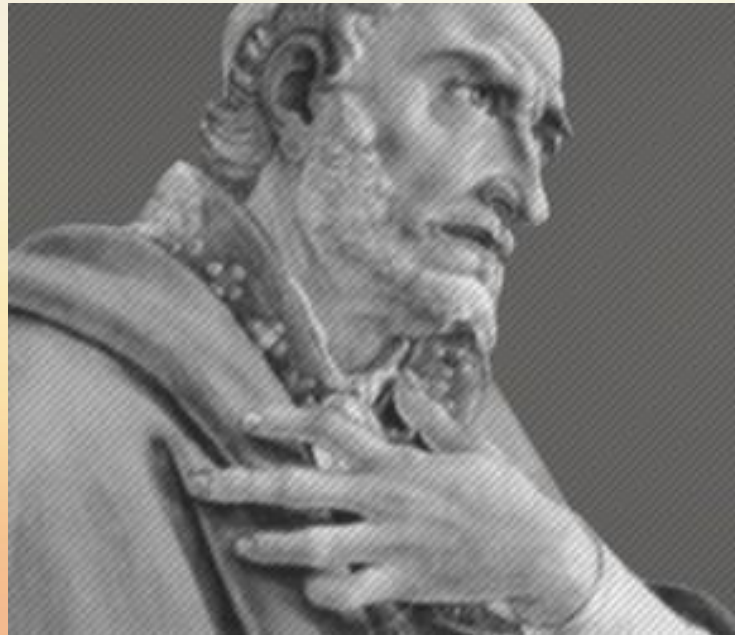
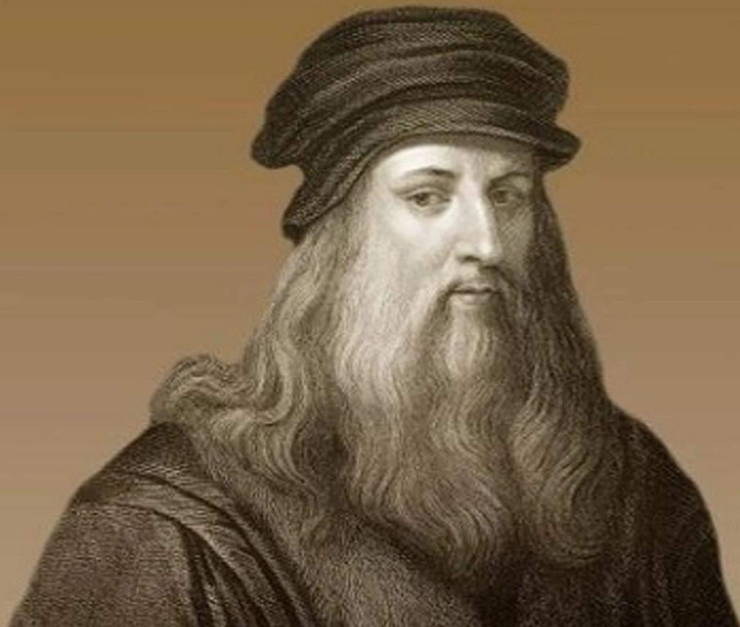
Such abacus persisted to limited use into the 9th century.

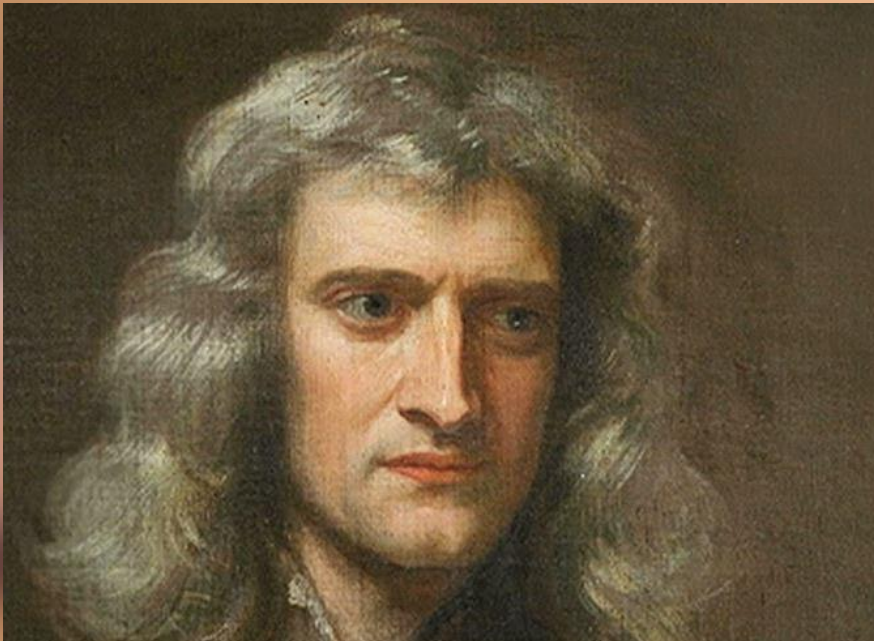
But then, a Pope reintroduced the abacus with modifications, and once again it became popular in Europe during the 11th century.

-the law and prophets (John 1:45),

-Revelation 11:3 (two witnesses prophecy 1,260 days).

-It is used 21 times in the books of Daniel and Revelation.

Represents teaching:

- five books of Moses.
- Second, Jesus taught about the five wise virgins and used five barley loaves used to feed the 5,000.

**Represents the worship
of man**



-It is used 273 times in the Bible, including its derivatives (e.g, sixth) and another 91 times as “threescore” or “60.”

-Man was created on the sixth day (Genesis 1:26, 31). See also Exodus 31:15 and Daniel 3:1.

-The number is especially significant in the book Revelation, as “666” identifies the beast. (Revelation 13:18).

**Represents law
and restoration**

-Of course, this includes the Ten Commandments found in Exodus 20.

-See also Matthew 25:1 (ten virgins);

-Luke 17:17 (ten lepers); healing

church and
God's authority

-Jesus had 12 disciples, and there were 12 tribes of Israel.

-In Revelation 12:1, the 24 elders and 144,000 are multiples of 12.

-The New Jerusalem city has:
+12 foundations,
+12 gates
+12 thousand furlongs,
+a tree with 12 kinds of fruit 12 times a year eaten by 12 times 12,000 or the 144,000.
(See Revelation 21.)

-The Jubilee came after the 49th year (Leviticus 25:10)

-Pentecost occurred 50 days after Christ's resurrection (Acts 2).

-Jesus chose 70 disciples (Luke 10:1).

-The number seven is also *the most common in biblical prophecy*, occurring 42 times in Daniel and Revelation alone.

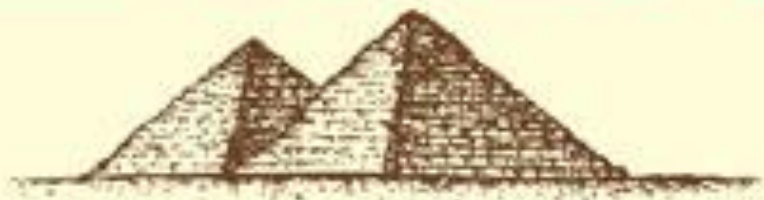

DEADLY SINS

also called seven capital sins or seven cardinal sins. In Roman Catholic theology, these are the seven vices that spur other sins and further immoral behaviour. They were first enumerated by Pope Gregory I (the Great) in the 6th century and elaborated in the 13th century by St. Thomas Aquinas.

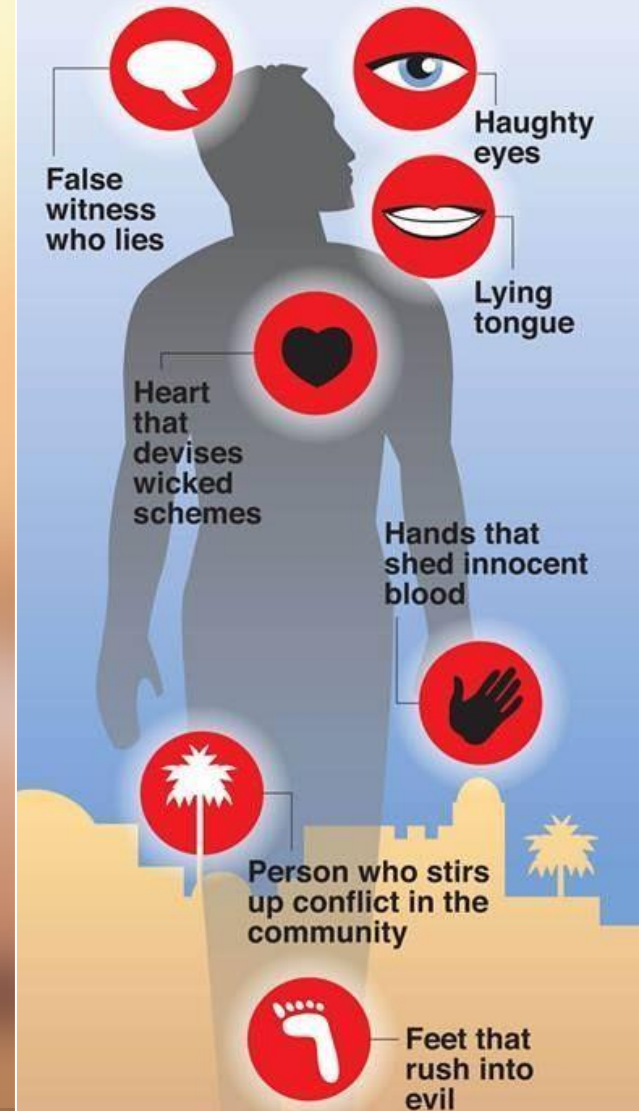
These can be overcome with the seven corresponding virtues of (1) humility, (2) charity, (3) chastity, (4) gratitude, (5) temperance, (6) patience, and (7) diligence.

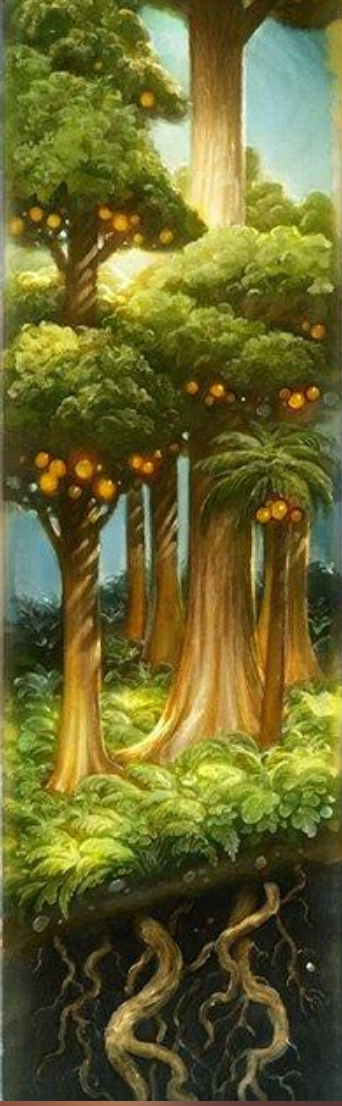
Proverbs 6:16-19

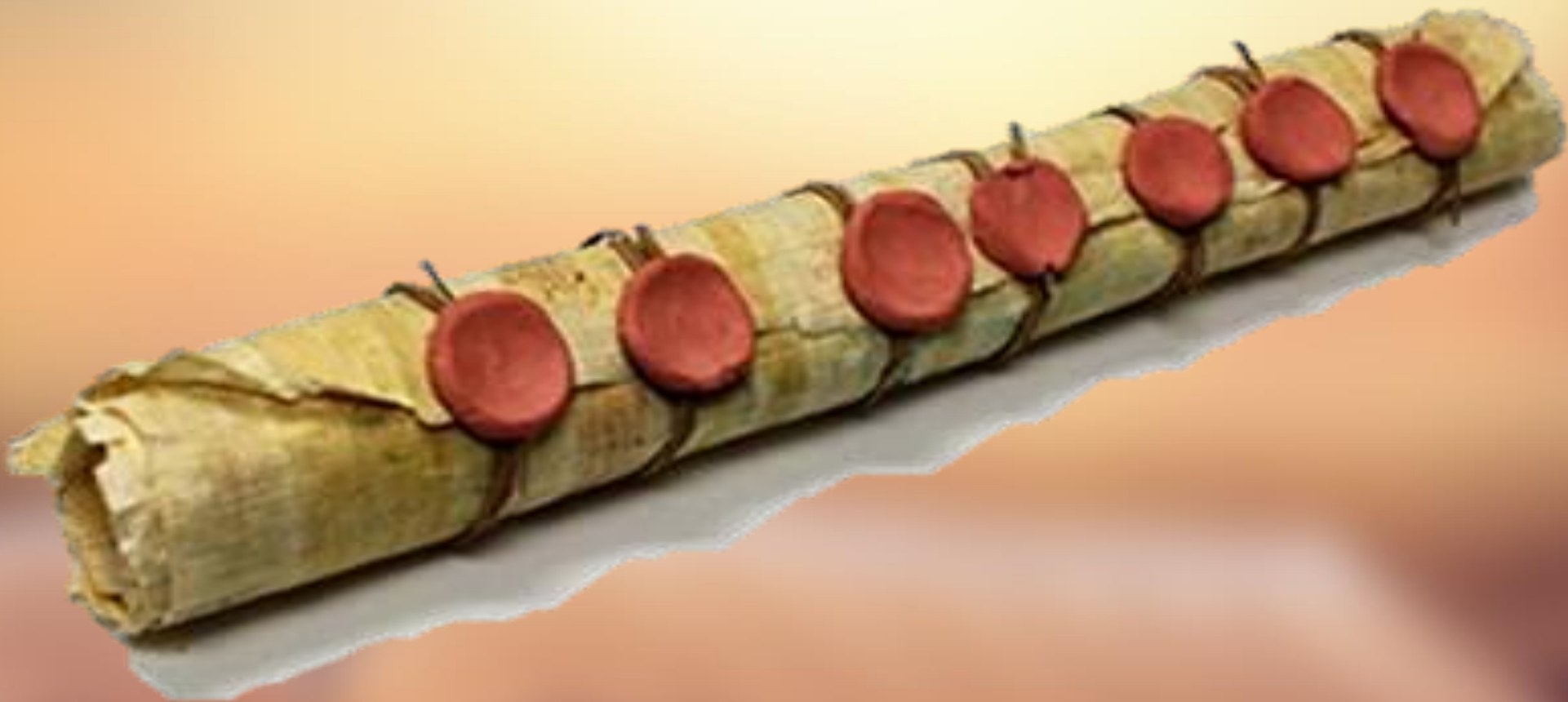
