



# History of STONING

Stoning seems to have been associated with sins that caused irreparable damage to the spiritual or ceremonial purity of a person or an animal.



#### SINS PUNISHABLE BY STONING

Murder: Leviticus 24:17 Idolatry: Deut. 17:2-5 Necromancy: Lev. 20:27 Blasphemy: Lev. 24:16 Sexual sin: Deut. 22:24. Lev. 20 Approaching Mt. Sinai: Ex. 19:12-13



You shall set bounds for the people all around, saying, 'Take heed to yourselves that you do not go up to the mountain or touch its base. Whoever touches the mountain shall surely be put to death.

Ex. 19:12

Not a hand shall touch him, but he shall surely be stoned or shot with an arrow; whether man or beast, he shall not live.' When the trumpet sounds long, they shall come near the mountain."

Ex. 19:13



And when a violent attempt was made by both the Gentiles and Jews, with their rulers, to abuse and stone them,




### At Lystra

So all those in the synagogue, when they heard these things, were filled with wrath,




and rose up and thrust Him out of the city; and they led Him to the brow of the hill on which their city was built, that they might throw Him down over the cliff.
